Pros

Cons

Due to Carbon Monoxide risks, **Portable Generators** have to be at least 10ft away from the home in a well ventilated weather shield, which protects it from the elements. Requiring manual start-ups, portable generators have to be monitored as they run on a finite amount of fuel also constantly causing whoever has to attend to it to be exposed to the weather conditions. In the event of an extended sporadic outage during a time where no one can be home to start a portable, there are risks that include the spoiling of perishable items and flooding inside the home due to failed power to a home's electric sump pump.
